- Evening prayer (BCP p. 139).
- Why pray the Psalms?
 - Jesus prayed the Psalms.
 - Believers have prayed the Psalms.
 - The Psalms are God's Word: we have permission!
 - They put the human condition into prayer.
 - * They speak <u>from</u> it.
 - * They speak to it.
- A couple examples. Psalm 55:1-14 (BCP p. 660). Psalm 37:1-12 (BCP p. 633).

- The psalms are the prayers of Jesus Christ.
- Suggestions for how to prayer the Psalms.
 - Regularly. Repeatedly.
 - Start to finish.
 - In a suggested cycle (BCP p. 935).
